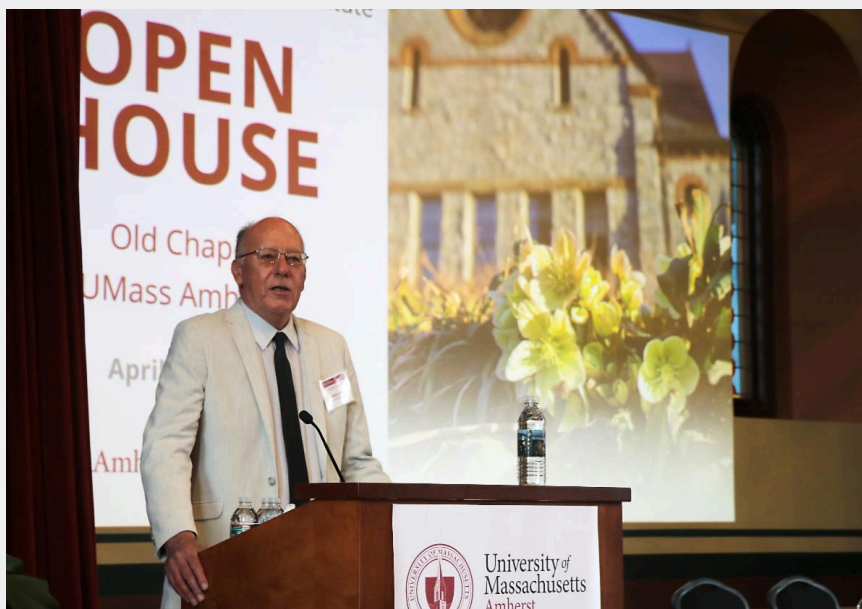
A message from Executive Director Johan E. Uvin

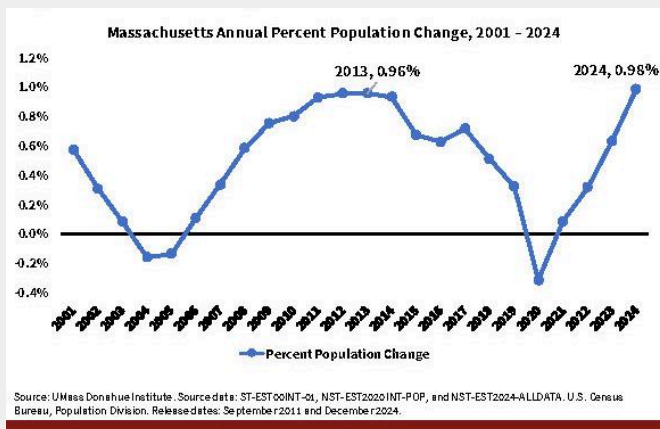

Massachusetts has the biggest population increase in a generation



The Massachusetts population grew significantly between 2023 and 2024, experiencing its largest annual percentage increase in 20 years! Concurrently, it was its largest numerical increase since 1964, at 69,603! The Census Bureau's adjustment to immigration in this year's series was a big factor in the estimated growth.
