Contracting Tools

UMass Donahue Institute is a pre-approved vendor on a number of procurement tools at both the federal and state levels. In many cases we are able to simplify the contracting process for eligible clients, minimizing or eliminating the need for a time-consuming, burdensome bid process. Examples of our contracting instruments include:

Federal

General Services Administration (GSA)



We are approved as a vendor on the GSA Professional Services Schedule (PSS). This allows us to offer Integrated Consulting Services and Training Services to federal clients

State

Interdepartmental Service Agreement (ISA)

As part of the University of Massachusetts system, UMass Donahue Institute is an eligible state agency and therefore can provide services to other Massachusetts state agencies using the ISA.

Commonwealth of Massachusetts

We are pre-approved as a vendor on statewide contract PRF61 via the Massachusetts Operational Services Division. Specifically through this contract, we are eligible to
